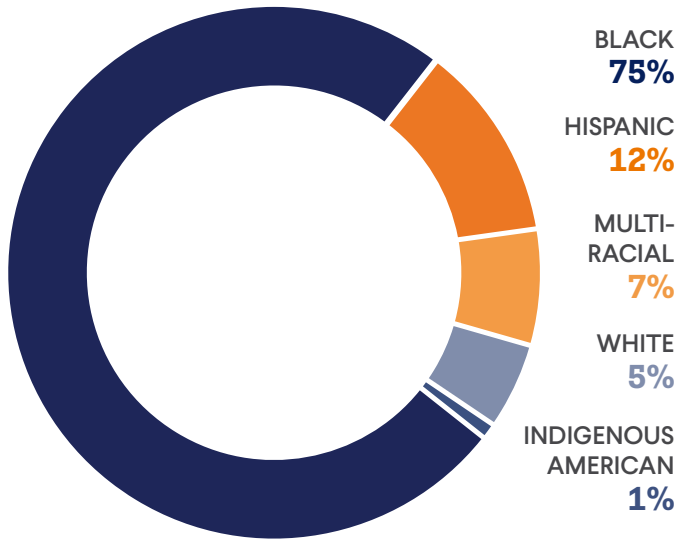

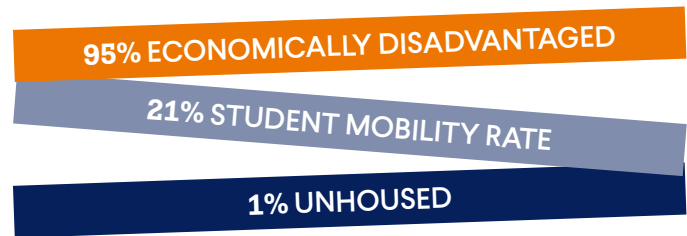
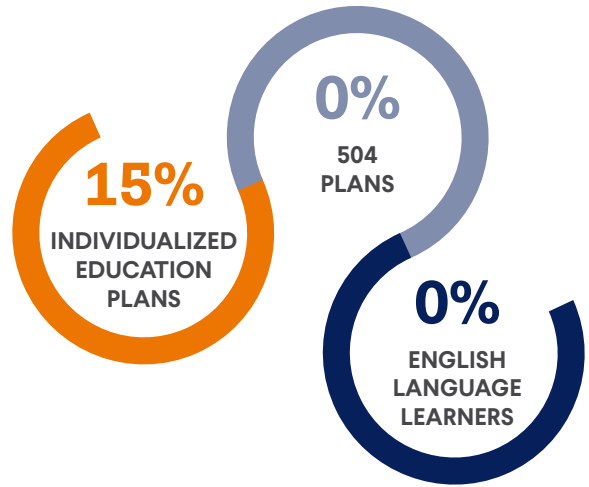
STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS



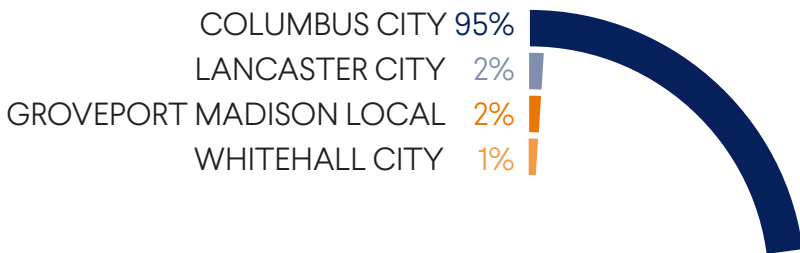

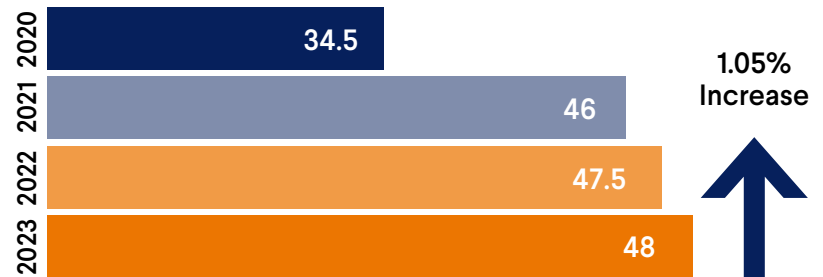
ACADEMIC PROGRESS

Capital Collegiate Preparatory Academy's academic goals for the 2022-23 school year were for:

- 80% of students in K-2 to achieve one year of growth in Reading on the i-Ready Growth Assessment
- 50% of 3-8 Grade students to score proficient in Reading on the Ohio State Assessment or show one year of growth on the i-Ready Growth Assessment
- 75% of K-8 students to achieve one year of growth in Math on the i-Ready Growth Assessment
- 50% of 3-8 Grade students to score proficient in Math on the Ohio State Assessment

CCPA increased its Performance Index (PI) score and met state expectations in student academic growth (3 Stars, Progress). Additionally, the school met one of their four academic goals (88% of K-2 students meeting their typical growth goal in Math). The school fell just shy of meeting its Reading goals with 76% of K-2 students meeting their typical growth goal. Additionally, 15.4% of students in Grades 3-8 scored proficient or above on the Ohio State Assessment.

YOY PERFORMANCE INDEX SCORE



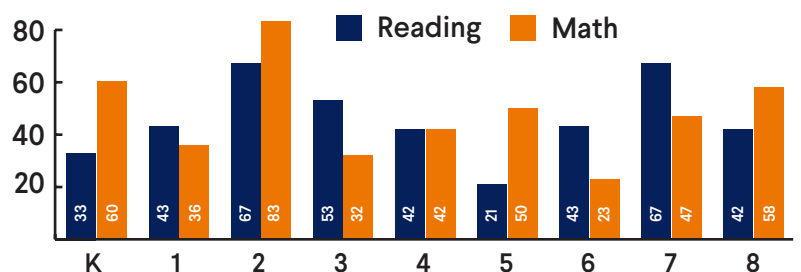
